

# RECIPIENTS OF PROCEEDS FROM DESERT FOUNDATION BALLS

The Desert Foundation, a board of seven trustees, distributes the funds from the Ball proceeds each year to charitable organizations which benefit primarily the people and children of the Scottsdale School District, Town of Paradise Valley and Carefree in Maricopa County, Arizona. The Trustees voted to retain 20% in the Foundation each year for a future major contribution.
